The horse's movement produces motion in muscles, tendons, skeletal structure, neuronal spinal fluid and activates core psycho-physiological energy.

In this workshop, participants learn to utilize full support team roles to provide mutually safe and beneficial experiences riding astride the horse. We explore basic principles, practice essential preparation of horse and human, and define and model support roles.


Barbara K. Rector, MA, CEIP-ED
